

Ozanam in the Vincentian Tradition: A Man of Ideas, A Man of Action

Ozanam devoted his life both

- to the service of "Eternal Truth" in the realm of **ideas** and
- to the service of the poor in the realm of action

In fact, we know from his writings that Ozanam repeatedly linked action to theory.
